

Vision Clinic Helps Patients See

Crystal is a long-time patient of Guadalupe Clinic and is on medications for chronic diabetes, cholesterol, and hypertension. Unfortunately, her diabetes was poorly managed for a time, resulting in accelerated vision loss.

As a person with diabetes, Crystal was aware her vision might be affected, reporting it had deteriorated significantly over time. Her health history and worsening eyesight made her a priority patient for an eye exam at our new Vision Clinic.

It had been seven years since Crystal had a vision exam. Her only option was cash for exams and eyeglasses, which she just couldn't afford. She was the first patient seen in our vision clinic and said, "I almost cried when I received the call asking if I wanted to schedule a free eye appointment." Her exam, by Dr.



Anita Campbell, was extensive with dilation and further testing for eye diseases.

Crystal's vision, although worsened, is corrected with an updated prescription. She picked out her eyeglass frames and, along with her lens prescription, we shipped them to a lab, where the lenses were manufactured and the eyeglasses assembled before sending See VISION, page 3

Most of them work demanding jobs that have them on their feet all day, in addition to co-morbidities like diabetes and hypertension that require orthopedic care. Volunteer Coordinator Elizabeth Stewart, was working on replacing him so we would not miss this vital service.

At a COVID vaccination clinic, she noticed one of the volunteer nurses wearing an Advanced OrthopedicsAssociation logo and decided to let her know about our need for orthopedics. That nurse



was Leigh Ann Lais, who works with her husband at AOA, where he is an orthopedic surgeon. Leigh Ann was curious about the Clinic and our partnership with Kansas Mobile Solutions, which allows us to have instant access to x-ray results performed weekly at our St. Francis location.

A few weeks later, Dr. Lais visited the Clinic to see how he could help our patients. He now volunteers once a month with his wife, Leigh Ann, to provide injections, splints, and other orthopedic services. They are a great team, and we are so happy to have them on board!


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them back to Guadalupe for Crystal to pick up. All at no cost to her.

Most recently, Maggie has agreed to volunteer twice a week to assist our new nurse practitioner, Heather French.

The Servant's Heart award honors the memory of Marlene Dreiling, the Clinic's Executive

Director, who passed away in 2012. Marlene's devotion and heart for the Clinic were evident every day and live on in the partnerships she initiated. Her efforts substantially improved and expanded the care available to patients.

An Update from J.V. Johnston, Executive Director

We are officially through the first quarter of our "new" fiscal year. Our staff have done an amazing job working to implement our Strategic Management Plan and all of its new initiatives – the Proactive Patient Care (PPC) model, same day clinic, and vision clinic.

We have promoted two staff members—one at each clinic—to fill the role of Promotor (health advocate). Spreading the duties of this position to two people allows the most support for our patients as they are encouraged to actively participate in their own health maintenance. A new patient packet was rolled out in mid-October for all new patients. The packet includes all of the necessary intake forms, as well as information on our clinics, services we provide, income guidelines, and a PPC member card for each patient which gives them direct access to the promotors at each location. Current patients are given updated information and intake forms at the start of the new calendar year.

The Vision Clinic is still a work in progress and is looking good. All of the necessary funds are in place, and grants have been submitted for additional equipment. We now have three volunteer optometrists – Drs. Diana Ho, Suzanne Buchanan, and Bob Nelson – in addition to the JayDoc clinic one night a month. Cairn Health generously allows us to send patients' prescriptions and frames to a lab in New Jersey, where they produce the lenses and mail them back to us at no cost to our clinic or the patient. We are incredibly blessed with this opportunity to help our patients improve their vision and overall health.

Christmas Food Boxes for Patient Families

This Christmas season Guadalupe Clinic continues its tradition of providing patients and their families with food boxes and Christmas gifts. We will have a drivethru style pick-up again this year to allow social distancing between volunteers and recipients. Distribution is at our South St. Francis location.
